ENTRY NIGHT - Bring your completed entry form(s) along with the correct entry fees to Birstwith Church Hall on Friday 21st July between 7pm and 8pm.

ENTRY MONTH - Leave your completed entry form(s) and the correct entry fees in the Birstwith Show Post Box at the **Dale Stores**, **Birstwith**. This service is available from the 1^{st} July until close of business at the Dale Stores on 21^{st} July.

POSTAL ENTRIES - You may post your completed entry form(s) along with the correct entry fees to BHS, Dale Stores, Birstwith, HG3 2NF. It is important to note that these must arrive no later than Friday 21st July. If they arrive late they cannot be processed and will not be entered.

STAGING NIGHT - Bring your exhibits to the Birstwith Show marquee on Friday 28th July between 7pm - 9pm

STAGING MORNING - Alternatively bring your exhibits on show morning Saturday 29th July between 8am - 9.45am

Free entry with 10 or more exhibits

Enter 10 or more different exhibits into the show and get a complimentary entry ticket to the Show Day. Obtain your ticket on staging night or morning, when you bring all ten or more exhibits to the show.

 are really sorry but if this isn't right we can't change it on show day, even
 if you have brought your prize winning entry with you!
- Make sure you read the class description correctly. Bring the correct number of items required and make sure they are the right dimensions.

Containers, backgrounds, bases, drapes, titles and mechanics may be included. Natural plant material should dominate but need not be grown by the exhibitor. Artificial plant material should not be used.

Exhibits must be the unaided work of the exhibitor but may be pre arranged and brought to the marquee complete.

Ingredients

- 8 ounces (220 g) unsalted butter, softened
- 1 cup (200 g) golden syrup, or light corn syrup
- 1/2 cup (110 g) soft dark brown sugar
- 1/4 cup (55 g) black treacle, or molasses
- 1 cup (200 g) self-rising flour
- 1/2 cup (110 g) medium oatmeal, or porridge oatmeal
- 4 teaspoons ground ginger
- 2 teaspoons nutmeg
- 1 teaspoon mixed spice, or pumpkin pie spice
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 2 large eggs, beaten
- 2 tablespoons milk, if needed

Method

- 1. Gather the ingredients. Preheat the oven to 275 F / 140 C / Gas Mark 1.
- 2. Grease an 8 x 8-inch square cake tin.
- 3. In a large, heavy-based saucepan, melt together the butter, golden syrup, brown sugar, and treacle over a gentle heat. Do not allow the mixture to boil; you simply need to melt them together.
- 4. In a large, spacious baking bowl, stir together the flour, oatmeal, ginger, nutmeg, mixed spice, and baking powder.
- 5. Gradually add the melted butter mixture, stirring to coat all the dry ingredients and mix thoroughly.
- 6. Gradually beat in the eggs a few tablespoons at a time.
- Add a tablespoon of milk at a time if the mixture feels dry. You are looking for a soft cake batter. Stir well.
- 8. Pour the mixture into the prepared tin and cook for 1 1/2 hours, until firm, set, and a dark golden brown.
- 9. Remove the parkin from the oven and leave to cool in the tin.
- 10. Once cool, slice and store the parkin in an airtight tin for a minimum of three days for the best flavor.

Rules and Regulations

- Please comply with the written information at the beginning of each section.
- Horticultural exhibits must be the exhibitor's property 2 months prior to the show, with the exception of plants entered as hanging baskets or containers. In this case plants may be purchased prior to planting.
- 3. No re-entry of prize winning exhibits, except in the horticultural section.
- Any infringement of the rules automatically disqualifies the exhibitor's entry and renders the exhibitor liable to forgo any prize money.
- Children's work must be the exhibitor's own work. If, in the opinion of the judges, there has been excessive adult input the judges may mark down the exhibit.
- Multiple entries are allowed per class however only one prize per exhibitor per class is permitted.
- All exhibits in Section D (Flower
 Arranging) must be the unaided work of
 the exhibitor. They may be prepared at
 home and brought to the marquee to
 complete.

- 8. The judges' decision is final.
- No person, exhibitor or competitor will be admitted to the show field without an official entry ticket.
- Where there are three entries or less in a class the judges reserve the right to award one or two prizes only.
- Any technical objection is to be handed to the Information Point in writing by 3.30pm on show day accompanied by a fee of £1, which will be refunded if the objection is upheld.
- 12. The sale of raffle tickets on the show field is not permitted, except with prior written permission from the committee. Consent will be subject to such rules that the committee may decide in its absolute discretion.
- All trade stands and stall holders must comply with the conditions laid down by the committee
- 14. All prize money is to be collected from the Information Point at approximately 3:30pm onwards, an announcement will be made on the day.
- 15. Exhibits are to be collected from the marquee no earlier than 4pm on show day. Any exhibits left after 5pm will be thrown away.
